Our Story

While working for DuPont Corporation in Barcelona, Silvia knew she needed to move her family to the States, so that, Marc, her son with autism could receive wonderful schooling opportunities. In Barcelona, Marc had such severe behavioral problems and his capabilities were overshadowed; Dismissals from school, lack of sleep, no socializing, and a limited learning environment was his daily reality.

Marc is now an adorable teenager that just happens to have autism. He loves riding his bike, dancing and baking. He's come a long way with the help of the Miami-Dade County Public School system, and Silvia is so grateful for the programs being offered to him.

But Silvia soon questioned what Marc's future would look like. What does the future hold for young adults with autism? The challenge begins after they turn 22. She quickly realized that employment opportunities looked bleak.

Silvia decided to take this employment challenge head on, and in Oct 2015 founded Miami Is Kind, an industrial bakery and factory for professionals with autism/~~DIS~~ABILITIES—the first of its kind in the US. Miami Is Kind now employs 6 bakers, and will soon employ packers, warehouse operators, customer service reps, and dispatchers with autism/~~DIS~~ABILITIES. The goal of this industrial bakery is to employ at least 20 young adults with this condition by the year 2020.

Miami Is Kind has demonstrated that with an adequate instruction, a properly structured workplace, and an enjoyable learning atmosphere, adults with Autism/~~DIS~~ABILITIES excel in the workplace—making the companies they work for profitable.
